2. The Autonomous Republic of Crimea is an integral part of Ukraine, the territory of which is subject to the Constitution and laws of Ukraine.

The Verkhovna Rada invites the UN, the OSCE, the Council of Europe, the European Union, NATO, the CIS and other interested international structures to organize field meetings of their bodies in Ukraine in connection with the possibility of the use of force by the Russian Federation on the territory of Ukraine. Earlier, Russian troops entered the territory of Ukraine in Crimea under the fake pretext of protecting the Russian-speaking population.

Resolution On the Appeal of the Verkhovna Rada

The Verkhovna Rada appeals to the Russian Federation with a demand for the immediate return of the military personnel of the Black Sea Fleet of the Russian Federation to their places of permanent deployment, as well as the withdrawal of other military formations from the territory of Ukraine.

The Appeal indicates that the decision to hold an all-Crimean referendum on March 16, 2014 by the Verkhovna Rada of the Autonomous Republic of Crimea contradicts the provisions of the Constitution of Ukraine. In the same Appeal, the Verkhovna Rada addressed the European Commission For Democracy through Law (the Venice Commission) regarding the decision of the Verkhovna Rada of the Autonomous Republic of Crimea dated March 6, 2014 to hold the so-called all-Crimean referendum, and also called on the residents of the Autonomous Republic of Crimea not to participate in the illegal referendum and thus demonstrate their position for the unity of the Ukrainian people and the territorial integrity of Ukraine.

The Resolution is aimed at taking preventive measures to counteract negative consequences that are likely to arise in case the Senate of the French Republic adopts pro-Russian proposals to lift the sanctions imposed by the EU against the Russian Federation.

Law of Ukraine “On Social and Legal Protection of Persons and Their Family Members Who Have Been Deprived of Their Personal Freedom as a Result of Armed Aggression Against Ukraine”

The Law regulates the issues of social and legal protection of persons whose individual freedom was infringed upon, according to the established evidence, in connection with the armed aggression against Ukraine. The Law aims to establish legal assurances for the protection of the rights of such persons and members of their families, as well as sets up procedures to ensure the implementation of their rights.

The Resolution adopted with an aim to condemn the aggression of the Russian Federation in the areas of the Black and Azov Seas and the Kerch Strait; to request granting assistance to Ukraine as a victim of aggression, to allow for exercising its inalienable right to self-defense; to ask for the adoption of effective collective measures to eliminate the threat to peace; to suppress acts of aggression of the Russian Federation in the areas of the Black and Azov Seas and the Kerch Strait, including conducting operations to ensure freedom of navigation. The Resolution also provides for an appeal to the President of Ukraine on the need to prepare and approve the Maritime Security Strategy of Ukraine, which shall strengthen integration ties with the world community; ensure economic and energy independence; guarantee the sustainable development and representation of Ukraine in the international arena.
